Glossary of Vocabulary

Hemisphere— The world is made up of the northern hemisphere and the southern hemisphere, which is separated by the equator.

Equator— an imaginary line that splits the world in half.

Latitude—lines of latitude are used to see how far a place is north or south of the equator. They run parallel to the equator.

Longitude—lines of longitude are used to see how far a place is east or west of the equator. They run from the top of the earth to the bottom.

Time zone— is a region or area that observes the same standard time.

Meridian—Time zones are divided by imaginary lines called meridians. They run from the North Pole to the South Pole.

Prime Meridian— is an imaginary line that runs through the UK. It runs through Greenwich in London, which is 0 degrees in longitude.
