Glossary of Vocabulary

- **Fieldwork**—the gathering of information about something in the real environment.
- **Grid references**—to locate specific items/places on a map.
- **Key**— explains what the different lines and symbols on a map mean.
- **Survey**— a way of reviewing a particular feature of the physical or human environment.
- **Questionnaire**— is a list of questions to enable people’s opinions about places and areas of interest.
- **Enquiry question**— the question the geographer is trying to answer.
- **Analyse**— what does the data tell us?
